The sash were custom made by Pella to fit the openings and to have the same look as before (ie. 9 lites per pane). The windows and moldings were then repainted the same colors as before. Only two new window shades were purchased, all the others were trimmed to size and reused. Now we have vinyl on the outside of the windows, insulated glass, and windows that open and seal very well. We again express our thanks and appreciation to the City of Stow for making this upgrade happen.
