
### **Stewart School News**

## **Heritage House Museum Update**



As you read in the last newsletter we are replacing the siding and trim on the Museum. In September the material supplier was selected and notified they would be providing the materials. On October 23<sup>rd</sup> a final review meeting was held by the installers and the lumber company salesperson. This meeting identified some additional items needed for the job. The additional expense was approved by a vote of the Board. The additional cost was paid and the material was delivered on Thursday October 24<sup>th</sup>. Work by Duda Constuction began after the delivery. Half of the siding on the south side of the museum was then removed. Work will continue weather permitting.

This is a major expense for SHS, so any donations to this effort will be greatly appreciated.
